## The Trésors du Dôme organization would like to thank all the citizens.

The organization *Trésors du Dôme* warmly thanks all the citizens who have contributed to the reduction, reuse, and sometimes recycling of items, preventing them from ending up in the waste. Thanks to the enthusiasm of volunteers, more than 1,080 hours were invested in 2024, in addition to participation in kiosks during events in the three municipalities. Since its creation in 2022, Le Dôme has generated significant revenue, including \$23,548.98 this year, which will be redistributed to vulnerable individuals in the municipalities of Mille-Isles, Wentworth, and Gore through a donation committee.

Since June 2024, *Trésors du Dôme* has been an official nonprofit organization, with a board of directors that has held its first meetings. The donation committee has finalized a form that will be used to refer citizens in need. We also want to thank the two community organizers, Amélie-Constance Richard and Martine Ayotte, for their valuable support.
