## MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR: CONGRATULATIONS FIREFIGHTERS

Dear citizens,

In 1981 our Fire Department consisted of several portable pumps, a 4x4 Ford carrying 500 gallons of water, one breathing apparatus and roughly 6 Fire Fighters who fought fires without proper fire suits to protect them. Much has changed since then and the focus of this article is on the men and women firefighters that respond to all emergencies in your municipality. Any person that is interested in becoming a firefighter in a Municipal Fire Department, that is to say, firefighters, officers, fire chiefs and prevention agents must satisfy minimal training as set out in the "Regulation respecting the conditions governing the exercise of functions within a municipal fire safety service".

This training requirement is part of the Fire Safety Act, adopted by Quebec in June 2000 and it establishes the training needed for municipal fire services in order to assure a minimal professional qualification. Better trained, firefighters can work more safely and protect the population more effectively. Training consists of theory and practice for a total 275 hours and upon completion of their training are required to pass a written and practical exam.

On June 20, 2011 the following Wentworth firefighters were presented their certificates for successfully completing their training program, *Yvan Zanetti, Jason Gaves, Brian Morrison, Chris Boyd and Kevin Sarazen*. We congratulate and thank them for taking the time away from their families and for their efforts to better serve our community.

In addition, we currently have a number of our firefighters who are taking Non Urban Officer and Pumper Operator specialty courses.

The Wentworth Fire Department is continually looking for candidates, both men and women, to bolster our ranks. Applications are available at the municipal office. So please consider helping your community and join up.
